BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL YEAR CHECKLIST

- Submit the school district volunteer application at CSISD.org found under the “Parent Info” tab. Scroll down to “Volunteering.” This is required each year to volunteer during school hours.
- Help our College Hills coordinator know how you prefer to volunteer by returning the VIPS Registration form or fill it out through the Google Form found on the “Volunteer” page at chpto.org.
- Text “@c4274g” to 81010 to receive helpful reminders by text from College Hills PTO with “remind.”
- Join any remind groups for your student’s teachers.
- Turn on “Get Notifications” at the top of the Facebook pages for “College Hills” and “College Hills Parent Teacher Organization—CHPTO” Otherwise, many posts will not appear in your newsfeed unless boosted with an ad buy. We’re too cheap for that:)
- Send in a donation to our “Show Your Stripes” Donation Drive to your child’s teacher or the office.
- Choose a time for a Parent Teacher Conference when your teacher is ready or on Oct. 10th.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Each May, our PTO presales school supplies to be packaged and delivered to the school as a convenience for parents. The markup on the wholesale cost serves to simplify accounting and allow for sales tax. This is offered as a service rather than a fundraiser.

T-SHIRTS & HOODIES

Each year, staff and students receive a single College Hills t-shirt to encourage school spirit and serve as a field trip uniform. Community sponsorships as well as the sale of additional t-shirts and hoodies provide for the expense of the free t-shirts. This is offered as a service rather than a fundraiser.

FALL FUNDRAISER

General PTO necessities and annual commitments require a minimum of \$5,000 to be raised during this year's Fall Fundraiser. This year, PTO will debut a donation drive.

SPIRIT NIGHTS & MCTEACHER NIGHT

Due to the significant amounts needed to fund our annual budget, our PTO has opted to include occasional spirit nights and a McTeacher Night to continue to raise funds. This helps to relieve the pressure from the Fall Fundraising and Paw Print Festival Committees with easier to coordinate and family friendly fundraising. We also prefer to bond together frequently as a College Hills family and support the local restaurants who often go above and beyond in their donations rather than participate in catalog sales based fundraising.

BOOK FAIR DINNERS

Book fairs are too fun to miss and book fair dinners help busy families be able to participate by taking care of dinner! Whether the dinner is offered at a minimal cost or with a recommended donation, the true purpose is to spend time together at the school and share with our children the love of reading. Parents teach a powerful message when they purchase books for their children, because that children see that books are valued in the home. Proceeds from tickets or donations are generally just enough to cover the costs of the event. However, increased book sales have been noted when a dinner is included. This increase in sales greatly benefits and is funneled directly into the library's budget.

BUSINESS PROMOTIONS

Even just a 10¢ donation from a "box top" adds up. Each year, College Hills families have used their typical purchasing habits to raise approximately \$1,500!

This year we would like to increase this amount in order to meet the goal of funding classroom grants/wish list budgets that do not currently fit into our budget.
